

IUU FISHING – FEBRUARY 2025 SUMMARY

Statistics:

- 13 incidents in February 2025, compared to 20 in February 2024.
 Violation of Certificate Conditions: 1 incidents (down from 1 in February 2024).
- Harvesting Prohibited Species: 5 incidents (down from 2 in February 2024).
- Illegal Nets: 3 incidents (down from 2 in February 2024).
- Illegal Methods: 3 incidents (down from 2 in February 2024).
 Explosive Fishing: 1 incidents (unchanged from February 2024).

Comments:

• The number of incidents in January 2025 has dropped a lot compared to January 2024, from 17 to just 6. This shows bod improvement in reducing illegal activities.




Statistics: • 12 incidents in February 2025, compared to 19 in February 2024 .


Patient onboard: 6 incidents (up from 5 in February 2024).






DRUG SMUGGLING INCIDENTS – FEBRUARY 2025 SUMMARY

Statistics: A total of 2 Drug smuggling incidents was recorded in February 2025, higher compared to February 2024
Kerala cannabis and Local cannabis reported 01 incidents
Heroin, Ice, Tablets and Hashish reported No Incidents.

Comments:

Heroin cases dropped to zero, while lce cases are rising Kerala cannabis incidents fluctuated, showing inconsistent trends. No reported incidents for Tablets, Hashish, and Local Cannabis suggest either low prevalence or underreporting

Comments:

Smuggling incidents increased in January 2025 compared to both last year and last month, which is a concern.
The incidents involved kendu leaves and other items, so stricter controls are needed to prevent further smuggling.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY – JANUARY 2025

<u>Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing</u>: Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing: A total of 13 IUU fishing incidents were recorded in February 2025, Iower than 27 in February 2024. Key observations include:

- Incidents involving illegal nets decreased to 3 (from 5 in 2024).
- Harvesting prohibited species dropped dramatically to 5 (from 7 in 2024).
- Explosive fishing 1 incident (1 in 2024).
- The overall decline reflects progress, though targeted enforcement for illegal nets is required.

<u>Poaching</u>: 10 poaching incident was reported in February 2025, a decrease compared to February 2024 (22 incidents). Palk Bay & Palk Strait remains a hotspot for activity. Other areas showed no poaching incidents, indicating shifts in patterns.

<u>Maritime Incidents</u>: 12 Maritime Incidents were reported in February 2025 <u>Drug Smuggling</u>: 02 Drug Smuggling incident were reported in february 2025 <u>Contraband Smuggling</u>: 02 contraband smuggling incidents were reported in February 2025 . These involved kendu leaves .

<u>Human Smuggling</u>: No incidents of human smuggling were reported in February 2025, maintaining stability in this category.

Explosive and Firearms Smuggling: No incidents were reported, consistent with previous months.

<u>Overall Analysis</u>: Illegal Fishing (IUU): Cases growth from 06 to 13, showing bad progress. However, illegal net use decreased, needing better enforcement. Poaching: Cases same with previous month , but Palk Bay and Gulf of mannar remain key trouble spots. increase Maritime incidents. Drug Smuggling increased, which is a positive sign.Contraband Smuggling, mainly involving kendu leaves . Stronger controls are needed. Human & Firearms Smuggling: No incidents, showing stability in these areas. Conclusion: While illegal fishing and poaching have decreased, contraband smuggling has increased. Continued enforcement is needed to maintain progress and reduce violations further.
