IUU FISHING – JUNE 2025 SUMMARY

Statistics:

• A total of 43 incidents were reported in comparison to June 2024, reflecting a decrease of 4.

No incidents were reported for violation of certification conditions and Explosive fishing.
Harvesting of prohibited species accounted for 2 incidents, an increase of 1.
The use of illegal nets rose markedly, with 25 incidents reported, an increase of more than 13 cases compared to June 2024.

• Only 6 incidents involving illegal methods were recorded, reflecting a notable decrease of 18 cases.

Statistics:

O6 incidents of contraband smuggling were reported in June 2025, marking an increase of 4 compared to June 2024.
 Among these, one incident involved Glyphosate, while 3 incidents were related to other & 2 incidents were reported Kendu Jeaves.

• No incidents were reported involving Cardamom, Gold & Turmeric.

Comments:

 Smuggling activities appear to have shifted focus toward alternative products such as liquids, sand, and soap items, with Kendu leaves emerging as the most frequently trafficked commodity highlighting a growing trend.

IFC COLOMBO SRI LANKA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY – JUNE 2025

Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing:

In June 2025, 43 fishing-related incidents were reported, a slight decrease of 4 from June 2024. Illegal net use rose sharply to 35 cases, while prohibited species harvesting saw a minor increase. Incidents involving illegal methods dropped by 18, and no cases of certification violations or explosive fishing were reported, indicating better compliance.

<u>Poaching</u>: In June 2025, 2 incidents were reported in the Palk Bay and Gulf of Mannar, a decrease of 3 from June 2024. No incidents occurred in the Eastern Coast, Palk Strait, or other areas, indicating localized reduction and overall regional stability.

<u>Maritime Incidents</u>: In June 2025, 27 maritime incidents were reported, an increase of 12 from June 2024. Key issues included technical failures, EPIRB alerts, and medical emergencies. Serious incidents like man overboard, capsizing, fire, and collision were minimal, with no cases of grounding or communication loss.

Drug Smuggling: No incidents of Drug Smuggling were reported in June 2025

<u>Contraband Smuggling</u>: In June 2025, six contraband smuggling incidents were reported an increase of four compared to June 2024. The majority involved Kendu leaves, while additional cases related to sand, liquor, and soap products were also recorded. Notably, no smuggling incidents involving cardamom, gold, or turmeric were reported.

<u>Human Smuggling</u>: One incidents of human smuggling were reported in June 2025. <u>Explosive and Firearms Smuggling</u>: No incidents of explosive and firearms smuggling were reported in June 2025, maintaining stability in this category.

<u>Overall Analysis</u>: In June 2025, maritime and coastal security trends presented a mixed outlook across various categories. A total of 43 IUU fishing-related incidents were recorded, showing a slight decline compared to the previous year. Notably, the use of illegal nets surged, while incidents involving illegal fishing methods and certification violations showed improvement. Poaching activity also declined, with only two cases reported and no incidents in other sensitive regions.

Maritime incidents rose significantly to 27, primarily attributed to technical failures, EPIRB alerts, and onboard medical emergencies; however, there were no reports of groundings or communication breakdowns. Contraband smuggling cases increased to six from two cases in last year, mainly involving Kendu leaves, sand, liquid, and soap products.

On a positive note, there were no reported incidents of drug trafficking, or the smuggling of explosives or firearms indicating sustained control in these high-risk areas. Human smuggling remained low, with only one case recorded
